Model of Men's Violence Against Women, which is similar to the CDC's socio-ecological model. After examining the root causes of violence at the various levels, the presenters assert that "each level of the community is accountable for performing anti patriarchal and anti colonial functions" in order to ultimately end the violence, and explore what success looks like at each level. They then (at minute 1:10:00) share a chart that organizations can use to evaluate how their work disrupts the root causes of violence at each level of the model.
